

Welcome back, Summer Games

/e're happy to report that
Kentucky's Special Olympics
Summer Games are back.
COVID-19 concerns forced cancellation of the 2020 games, but this year's event is happening.

Kentucky's Touchstone Energy Cooperatives, including Inter-County Energy, have taken a leading role in supporting the games for eight years now. We are a leading sponsor for the competition set for June 5 on the campus of Eastern Kentucky University.

The 2021 games will be limited to a single day of competition, and many protocols will be observed to protect participants' health and safety, says Trish Mazzoni, president and CEO of Special Olympics Kentucky.

What we love most about the games remains unchanged, however.

More than 1,000 special athletes from throughout the commonwealth will again have the opportunity to compete with their peers in five sports: aquatics, bocce, rhythmic gymnastics, soccer and track and field. And nearly 500 volunteers will be there to help the games run smoothly.

Supporting the summer games gives us an opportunity to remind the world about the principles we adhere to as a cooperative. In particular, it allows us to demonstrate our commitment to the communities we serve.

"Special Olympics is community-driven and predominantly a volunteer organization, so it's a great fit for co-op support," says Inter-County Vice President of Member Services Dan Hitchcock.

When the games were last held, nearly 100 Touchstone Energy co-op representatives were there. Working at the games is an annual family affair for some.

"Even after working all day, you feel better than when you arrived," says Member Services Advisor April Burgess, who explains why she enjoys volunteering at the games. "It's very rewarding to see the level of effort and the heart of the participants, and the special moments that occur throughout the day."
