Inter-County Energy sponsors students on Washington Youth Tour

hen you hear about
Inter-County Energy investing
in the communities we serve,
it's not just in electrical infrastructure,
economic development or the local
events we support. We also have a national reach, sponsoring local students
each year on the Washington Youth Tour.

In June, three local rising seniors joined 59 other electric co-op students from across the commonwealth for a weeklong, all-expenses-paid trip to Washington, D.C. The trip gives Kentucky's next generation of leaders the chance to meet with their senators and representatives and to participate in civic engagement activities with students from across the country.

"Getting to experience D.C. in such a unique way really influenced my view on our nation's history and I am extremely grateful to have had this opportunity. Although you learn about important milestones and landmarks in your history class, it really brings those to life when you are surrounded in such a historic place like Washington D.C.," says Amanda Morrow from Garrard County High School.

Students were joined in Washington, D.C., by more than 1,800 delegates





representing electric co-ops from across the country. Marking its 58th year, the Washington Youth Tour educates students about the issues facing co-ops, encouraging them to come home to Kentucky and help lead the co-ops in the future. "This experience has helped me grow as a person and helped me learn more about what I want to do with my future," says Laci McGinnis from Mercer County Senior High School.

The busy itinerary included stops at national memorials, Smithsonian museums, the Holocaust Museum and International Spy Museum, Arlington National Cemetery and Thomas Jefferson's Monticello. At the U.S. Capitol, Inter-County Energy students interacted with Kentucky's congressional delegation, including Sen. Rand Paul and representatives Brett Guthrie, Thomas Massie, James Comer, Andy Barr and Morgan McGarvey. Students also heard from staff members representing Sen. Mitch McConnell and Rep. Hal Rogers.

"I am so glad I applied for this opportunity. My favorite part was the Lincoln Memorial and meeting a lot of new people from across the state," says Will Palagi, a student at Marion County High School.

Coordinated by Kentucky Electric Cooperatives, this trip gives students the unique opportunity to witness our government in action. "This trip is designed to give students a personal understanding of American history and their role as a citizen by meeting their Representative and Senators," says Mallory Wafzig, the statewide association's cooperative outreach manager and youth tour director.

Kentucky's co-ops have sent rising high school seniors on the Washington Youth Tour since 1972. "We are investing in our local students because we believe it is important for young leaders to see our nation's capital and gain a better understanding of what it means to be a citizen," says Jerry Carter, Inter-County Energy CEO.

Step 1: Register your account in SmartHub

Now is the time to take advantage of features like alerts/notifications, Auto Pay, and paperless billing to have more control over your account.


Step 3: Managing your account from anytime at anywhereThe more features you take advantage of, the more time and money you can save!

Please take a moment to register your account in our new SmartHub payment system by going to our website and clicking on SmartHub.

PREPAY INFORMATION

If you were currently signed up for PrePay with us you will need to re-sign up for account alerts.. Instructions to quickly get your account registered and re-sign up for alerts are posted below.

RE-REGISTER YOUR ACCOUNT

- Register your account in our new SmartHub system.
 You can register through the Web Portal or register through our Mobile App.
- After registering your account use the web portal or mobile app to re-setup Auto Pay on your account.

SETUP PREPAY ALERTS (WEB PORTAL)

- Log in to SmartHub web portal.
- From the home screen click on Notifications menu.
- From the Notifications screen you will manage contacts to set up your phone for text alerts.
- You will assign your new phone contact to the PrePaid alert types available.

SETUP PREPAY ALERTS (MOBILE APP)

- Log in to the mobile app.
- From the main screen click on the More... button in the bottom right and then the Settings menu.
- From the Settings screen you will manage contacts to set up your phone for text alerts.
- From the Settings screen you will assign your new phone contact to the PrePaid alert types available.

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AUTO PAY SETUP (WEB PORTAL)

- Log in to SmartHub web portal.
- From the home screen click on Billing & Payments menu for IOS or click on the three lines in the upper left-hand corner for Android platforms.
- From the Billing & Payments screen click on the Auto Pay Program sub-menu.
- Click on Sign Up for Auto Pay and follow the instructions on the screen.

AUTO PAY SETUP (MOBILE APP)

- · Log in to the mobile app.
- From the main screen click on Bill & Pay at the bottom of the screen.
- Tap on the Auto Pay Program sub-menu and follow the instructions on the screen.

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Be alert to electric hazards during harvest

arming accidents can happen without much notice, but having - knowledge and awareness about potential electric hazards can prevent injuries, suffering and even death.

Before moving large farm machinery, always walk around the entire vehicle to look for guy wires, transformers and meter sockets, which can be extremely hazardous if there is contact.

If you are harvesting corn or soybeans, look up and keep the grain harvester spout at least 10 feet below and clear of overhead lines. When switching grain bins, lower the auger to prevent contact with power lines.

If you are moving and lifting irrigation pipes, have a spotter watch to make sure you stay away from overhead lines.
